DUTCH TRAIL CUTTERS CONTINUE TO CELEBRATE 50-PLUS YEARS by Henry Hartman

In the fall of 2021, we started to tell you about the history of the Lancaster County based Dutch Trail Cutters Snowmobile Club, which was formed in early 1971. Here is another flashback from 50 years ago.

An earlier article in this series mentioned the club purchasing 5 acres of land in Havice Valley, Mifflin County, in 1972. Here are some highlights from meeting minutes in 1974 and 1975:

September 9, 1974 Still no word when electric service will be done. Cabin will be "inspected" Sept. 10th. The Financial Committee reported they will prepare an annual budget for operating and maintaining the cabin.

October 8, 1974 Reported that Phone Company will put in poles if three are purchased.Electric Co. will lease the poles from Phone Company and put lines in. Cost \$18.00 plus \$5-6 per month, members voted to go ahead with phone service. Basement steps are in, upstairs is well under way. Voted to buy 60 mattresses at \$5.00 each. Club will renew PSSA membership.

November 12, 1974 Still not full consent by property owners for electric service. Furnace to be installed very soon. Discussed getting fire extinguishers and first aid kit for cabin. Will check on prices for a "dog sled" for cabin.

December 10, 1974 Received letter from DER about Safety Training for 10-16 year olds. Still no decision on electric. Seven members volunteered for a "Furniture Committee". Cost of cabin so far is \$10,800.45.

January 14, 1975 Thirty four members are shown on the roster. Received application forms for Safety Instructors from DER. Will probably be installing fireplace in cabin in near future. Beds need to be painted. Cabin has been assessed at \$1,490.00 for tax purposes.

February 11, 1975 Phone Company plans to install poles in the near future. Letter received from George Ward with PSSA about attending one of our meetings. Furniture Committee reported receiving some donations.

March 11, 1975 Reported that a "rescue sled" will be donated to the cabin. Not much progress with electric, will check with other property owners to ask for a decision. Total cabin cost to date is \$11,958.42. Taxes at assessed value will run \$131.12 annually.

Today, 50 years later, the Dutch Trail Cutters are still a 100% PSSA club! Every member of the club is also a member of the State organization, supporting snowmobiling across the entire Commonwealth. In future articles, we will explain more about how the clubhouse was finished out as a livable structure.

World's largest snowmobile race returns to Sault Ste. Marie

SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich. (WLUC) - Crowds braved freezing temperatures to watch their favorite racers in the 56th <u>International 500 Snowmobile Race</u> in Sault Ste. Marie on Saturday.

I-500 Co-chair Carri Bradley says it's the largest snowmobile endurance race in the country.

"It's just amazing for our community," Bradley said. "Our founding fathers put this together with in mind that we are very cold here in the winter. We don't have a lot of visitors come here in the winter."

Bradley says the race brings in \$3.5 million every year in four days. She also says 80% of the spectators are Michiganders, like Allan Schultz from Grand Rapids. He says he's attended the race for about 30 years and is amazed at how far the race has come.

"They get it done in about eight hours, used to take 13 hours, you know that's how far this stuff has come along through the years, so good time," Schultz said.

Drivers made 500 laps on a one-mile oval race track, going over 100 miles per hour. Miss I-500 Pageant Queen Reanne Rau says it's cold, but she is excited to watch the race for a second time.

"It's just an amazing organization that runs this, and it's all volunteer-based," Rau said. "Seeing all these people come together is such a great and amazing thing to witness."

She says the race is a sight to see and a one-in-a-million chance to view a track this big.

"If you haven't been here, you have to come here and see it," Bradley added. "It will be nothing like you ever experienced. If you want to volunteer, we're always looking for volunteers; again, we are driven by volunteerism."

Bradley says the volunteers and spectators made the race reach another year. This year's I-500 winner is #18 Dan Revering of the Nelson Racing Ream.

Snowmobilers discover ideal conditions on state trails in Pennsylvania. Here's why

Cold weather and lots of snow this winter have created rare exceptional opportunities for <u>snowmobilers in Pennsylvania</u>.

Recent snowstorms have produced the right conditions for snowmobilers who are used to having to travel to find a good snowpack.

Chris Carpenter, 55, of Buffalo Mills, Bedford County, traveled to the Somerset/Westmoreland county area Sunday to snowmobile with his son on Laurel Mountain.

The area is home to Laurel Ridge and Laurel Mountain state parks and the approximately 120 mile Laurel Highlands Snowmobile Trail System that traverses over state park and state forest land. Weather permitting, snowmobiling is permitted through April 1.

Carpenter has been snowmobiling about 30 years.

"In the winter, there are not a lot of things to do rather than sit in the house. I love to get out and enjoy the snow. I love the snow," Carpenter said. "I like to ski, I like to snowmobile. I do a lot of motorcycle riding, ATV riding, jet skis, I have them all. But of all those power sports, snowmobiles are by far my favorite."

He likes that he can explore terrains on a snowmobile that may be accessible only by foot in other times of the year.

"When we go to Ontario or Quebec or the Upper Peninsula or Maine or wherever we ride, you've got a lot of miles that you can cover. It's fantastic in Pennsylvania when we get the weather," he said.

His family recently returned from a snowmobile trip with his son in Michigan where they rode about 900 miles. "It was good," he said about the escape.
